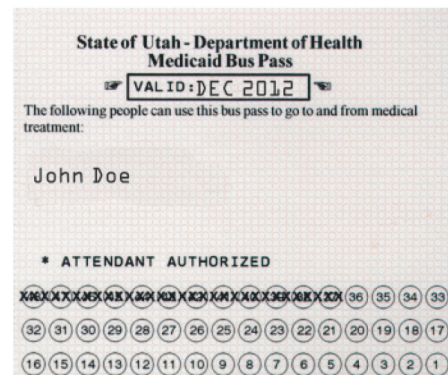


Changes coming to the Medicaid Punch Pass

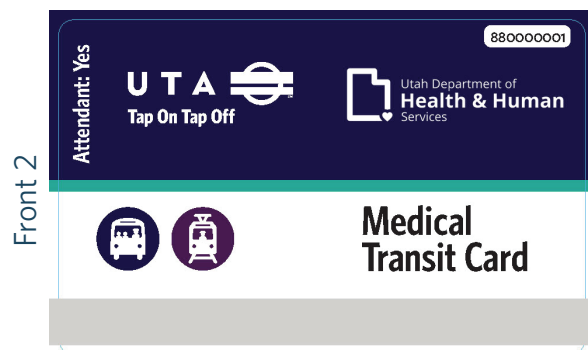
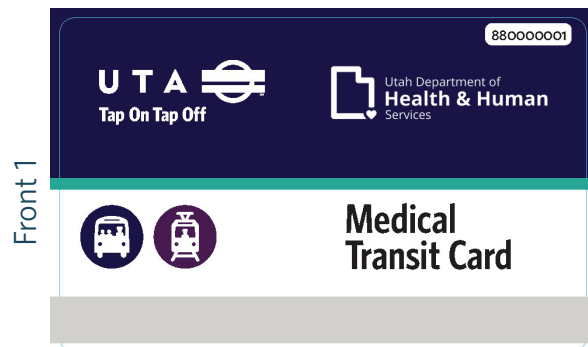
Old Pass: Expires June 30, 2022

- Paper pass
- Valid on UTA Bus, TRAX, Streetcar, BRT and UTA On Demand
- Operator validates fare by punching the pass for each rider
- Pass valid for month printed on the pass
- Authorized rider's names were listed on the punch pass
- The operator punches the pass for each rider, including personal care attendants



New Pass: Starts July 1, 2022

- New name: **Medical Transit Card**
- Electronic Fare Collection (EFC) card
- Valid on UTA Bus, TRAX, Streetcar, BRT and UTA On Demand
- Fare validated when the customer taps on/off a UTA Card Reader
- The same pass will be used each month
- Active passes will receive a green light. Non-active passes will receive a red light. Trust the light.
- Each rider will have his/her own pass and must validate the pass individually on a UTA Card Reader
- Member with "Attendant: Yes" printed on his/her pass (as shown on "Front 2") may ride with one assisting person. This assisting person will not have a pass and is not required to pay to ride so long as he/she is riding with an authorized member



The new EFC Medical Transit Card goes into effect July 1, 2022.

Back

- This is an electronic card. You must tap card to electronic reader as you board and exit.
- User must provide valid photo identification upon request.
- This pass is only valid fare when you have tapped the card, and it is properly validated (green light) by an electronic reader. A red light indicates the pass has expired or is no longer valid.
- This pass is not valid on FrontRunner, Ski, Paratransit, PC-SLC Connect, or other special services.
- This pass is not redeemable for cash value. Not for re-sale. Not transferrable.
- Improper use of this pass will result in confiscation.
- UTA cardholder rules apply. Refer to rideuta.com for information regarding use of this pass.
