TRAX

Have you ever heard of UTA TRAX?



TRAX is an electrically-powered light rail system that services 50 stations with 42.5 total miles of line!

It also is in service 7 days a week! This is what TRAX looks like!



TRAX runs stops from:
Blue Line: Salt Lake Central to Draper Town Center
Red Line: University Medical Center to Daybreak Pkwy
Green Line: Salt Lake International Airport to West Valley Central



STREET CAR

Street Car (or S Line) is a small train located along the Sugarhouse and South Salt Lake neighborhoods. It shares a station with TRAX lines!

Street Car: South Salt Lake City to Fairmont

BUSES



UTA Buses are more specific to an area or purpose!



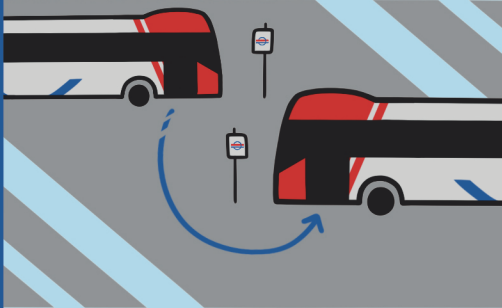
Buses look more like this!

They are numbered with a route...

And have regularly scheduled pick-up and drop-off times!



You can travel to another bus stop or train station by bus, so it's easy to connect your travel routes!

FRONTRUNNER

UTA FrontRunner is a commuter train! It includes more comfortable seating, restrooms and WiFi complimentary for the longer rides! It serves 15 stations total.

The FrontRunner operates Monday through Saturday,

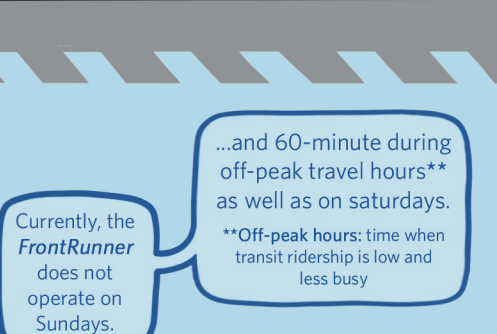
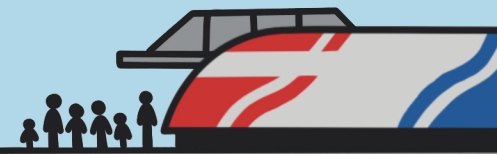
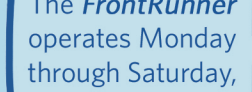
with 30-minute weekday service during peak travel hours*...

*Peak hours: time when transit ridership is highest and busiest (generally AM and PM peaks)

...and 60-minute during off-peak travel hours** as well as on Saturdays.

Currently, the FrontRunner does not operate on Sundays.

**Off-peak hours: time when transit ridership is low and less busy



FUN FACT!

The FrontRunner train runs for 83 miles, reaching speeds up to 79 miles per hour!



OTHER UTA TRANSIT MODES

BUS RAPID TRANSIT

UTA Bus Rapid Transit, or BRT, is a fast and efficient UTA service!

This is how it looks!



BRT buses arrive every 15 minutes!

Benefits of *BRT* can include dedicated bus lanes and busways, priority at traffic signals, enhanced bus stations and elevated platforms.



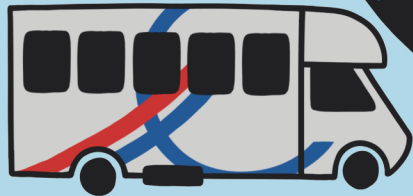
There are currently **3 BRT routes:**

- Utah Valley Express (UVX)
- Ogden Express (OGX)
- Midvalley Express (MVX)

PARATRANSIT

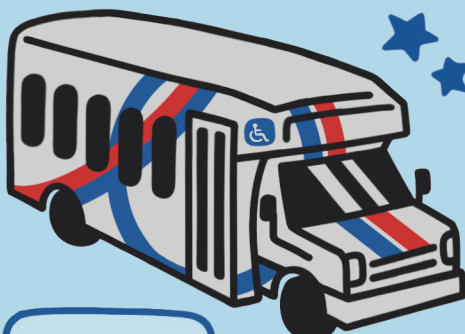
UTA Paratransit is a service for eligible riders who are unable to independently use fixed UTA service.

The buses look like this!



Paratransit provides an origin-to-destination service...

...so that you can be taken to your desired locations!



Paratransit destination locations must be within 3/4 of a mile of fixed routes or TRAX stations.

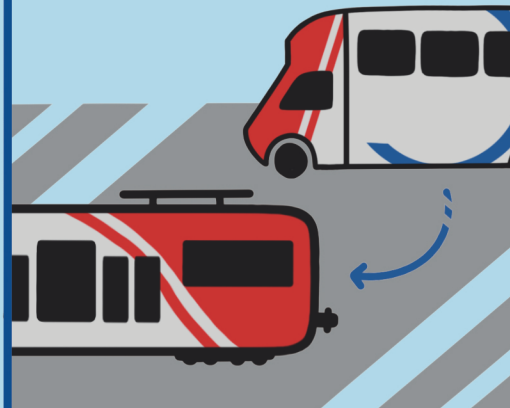
"How do I Apply?"

You can apply through an in-person interview and abilities assessment To be eligible to ride *UTA Paratransit!*

FLEX ROUTES

UTA Flex Routes are able to be deviated by making a deviation request through phone call or when boarding!

What the bus looks like!



You can connect to other *UTA* services with *Flex Routes!*

The route can deviate up to 3/4 of a mile from the buses original route.

Per *Flex Route* trip, 2 route deviations can be made!

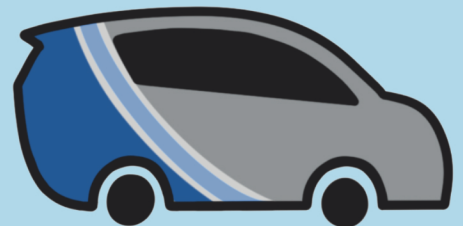
Riders need to schedule a route deviation no less than two hours before a trip and no more than seven days in advance of their trip.

The *Flex Route* deviations are first come, first serve. Remember, you can call ahead to secure your trip deviations!

ON DEMAND

UTA On Demand can connect you to other UTA services...

...or can drop you off close to your desired location within a zone! (corner-to-corner service)

Through using the *UTA On Demand* mobile app...



...you can be matched with other riders that are heading in a similar direction as you!

On Demand operates in...
 - Southern Salt Lake County
 - Salt Lake City Westside
 - Tooele County
 - South David County
 - West Provo/Orem

Children under the age of 13 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to ride *UTA On Demand.*
